Language & culture

Impressions



The Catholic University of Eichstätt-Ingolstadt (KU) gives students and professionals from all over the world the opportunity to study abroad in the heart of Bavaria.

You can choose between three different courses that include language classes to suit your level of proficiency. You will gain valuable insights into German and Bavarian cultural traditions and history, and also have the chance to visit iconic landmarks. We organize excursions to destinations such as the medieval town of Rothenburg ob der Tauber and the UNESCO World Heritage site Regensburg. The Summer School will be an unforgettable experience for you.

Additionally the KU International Eichstätt Summer School will earn university students credit points according to the regulations of your home university.

Course 1 | Study German in the Heart of Bavaria

(100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German language course for beginners (86 hrs)

Language requirements: none.

By using communicative games, short role-plays and dialog games, individual and team work you will learn how to introduce yourself, start a conversation, ask and answer questions. By the end of the course, you will be able to make yourself understood with ease.

Target group

Students without knowledge of German.

Course 2 | Intensive German and Cultural Studies

(100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German language course (57 hrs)

Language requirements: basic to advanced level, according to your individual level of proficiency.

Speaking and listening skills will be practiced intensively, but reading and writing skills will not be neglected. An important component of the cultural education will be project work, in which the participants will go in small groups and meet up with their interview partners, in order to carry out research on a specific topic.

Conversation and cultural studies I (option I) (29 hrs)

Language requirements: basic to intermediate level.

In this course, participants will have a number of opportunities to practice speaking. Everyday communication (e.g. shopping, ordering food, finding one's way, travelling) will be practiced through role plays, short interviews, short presentations, dialogs, and simple discussions. In addition, participants will learn how to convey their communicative needs (e.g. preferences, assumptions and opinions, cultural differences). Based on these topics, relevant vocabulary and idioms will be taught. Special emphasis will be placed on speaking in authentic situations.

Conversation and cultural studies II (option II) (29 hrs)

Language requirements: upper-intermediate to advanced level.

In this course, participants will focus on gaining cultural awareness of Germany. The goal of this course is to help students improve their vocabulary and gain confidence while speaking and while discussing interesting (inter-)cultural studies topics. Participants will be able to help choose the topics discussed during this course. This course allows students to expand their personal communication skills by giving short presentations and working in small groups.

Target group

Students who have an interest in the German language and experience with the German culture.



Course 3 | Intensive German and German Literature

(100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German language course (57 hrs)

Language requirements: upper intermediate to advanced level.

Speaking and listening skills will be practiced intensively, but reading and writing skills will not be neglected. An important component of the cultural education will be project work, in which the participants will go in small groups and meet up with their interview partners, in order to carry out research on a specific topic.

Literature course: water in literature (29 hrs)

The water's cultural history can be traced back to the creation myths of mankind, to the beginnings of the occidental philosophy as well as to the greatest epics of literary history. Water is considered a symbol of life as well as death, of liberation as well as threat, a source of wisdom and a symbol of the unconscious. The different forms and facets of water and the sea as motifs in literature are the topics of this course.

Target group

Students with both interest in and experience with German language and literature.
