

Regulations for Applicants of Autonomous Learning at the German Department of Wenzao University

1. To enhance the self-learning abilities of students, to offer diverse and flexible learning patterns, to foster cross-field exploring and life-long learning, the University has established the “Regulations for the Application of Autonomous Learning for Students of Wenzao University”.
2. At our department, “Autonomous Learning” aims at cross-field learning. Its scope can be summed up in the following kinds of courses:
 - (1) All-English courses (EMI) at national and international universities or institutions.
 - (2) Cross-field courses not opened by our department.
3. Eligible applicants: Four-Year-College students from our department (year 1 to 4) and Five-Year-College students (year 4 or 5), who have already passed the German language graduation criteria.
4. Time of application: Students who wish to apply have to present an application form for Autonomous Learning one semester in advance of the intended time, according to the application date as announced by the Department.
5. Evaluation procedure: the Chair of the Department convenes the Curriculum Designing Group to examine the student’s application form. If the application is successful, the student may pursue his/her plan in the following semester.
6. “Autonomous Learning Course” credits can be credited under Professional Obligatory Courses, Professional Elective Courses, General Elective Courses and Common Obligatory Courses set by the University (Common English Courses of the Four-Year-College excluded). Professional Obligatory Courses, Professional Elective Courses and General Elective Courses are reviewed by the Department, but repeated or substituted courses and courses that have been failed previously are excluded. A maximum of 20 credits may be credited. Common Obligatory Courses set by the University are to be reviewed by the unit that opens the course; credited may be a maximum of 20 credits (hours).
7. These regulations shall apply after approval by the College Meeting. This goes also for amendments.
