1.A total of 135 credits are required for graduation: 46 credits of university required courses + 4 credits of college required courses + 60 credits of department required courses + at least 21 credits of interdisciplinary program courses (6 credits of Interdisciplinary Cores + 15 credits of Department Electives) + 4 credits of elective courses. A bachelor's degree and a certificate of program completion will be conferred at graduation.

(1)There are two program interdisciplinary programs offered: European Business Affairs and European MICE and Translation.

(2)If students need to change the program, the newly replaced program course must still be at least 21 credits.

(3)Internship courses can be counted as general elective credits.

2. Students have to pass the Language Proficiency Test standards required.

3.Students are required to satisfied other graduation requirements of the school.
